


Figure 1: Front Panel LED




Figure 2: Bottom Connectors




Figure 3: Rear Connectors

Installation

Using Power over Ethernet (PoE)

 Use a standard Ethernet cable to connect the LAN (PoE) port on the DAP-2620 to a PoE power source device such as an 802.3af PoE switch or 802.3af PoE injector.

Configuration

Using Nuclias Connect

The DAP-2620 is designed to be managed through Nuclias Connect. Refer to the **Nuclias Connect Manual** for detailed configuration instructions.

Manual Configuration

Note: D-Link recommends manually configuring the device before mounting it. The management computer, DHCP server and DAP-2620 must be in the same subnet.

Use one of the following methods to access the web user interface:

Connecting through Ethernet

- Use an Ethernet cable to connect the DAP-2620 to the management computer, or to the switch or router the management computer is connected to.
- Manage the access point from a computer.
 Enter dap2620.local in the address field of your browser.
- 3. Log in to the administration user interface. The default login information is

Connecting Wirelessly

- Connect the management computer to the default SSID of the DAP-2620, "dlink".
- Manage the access point from a computer.

Mounting

Mounting on a Solid Wall

For optimal coverage, mount the DAP-2620 on the wall. An Ethernet cable running through an electrical wall box should be pre-installed before mounting.




Figure 4: Attaching the Mounting Plate

- Place the mounting plate over an electrical wall box and mark the location where to drill the holes in the wall. The Ethernet cable and the telephone cable (optional) should pass through the mounting plate.
- 2. Drill holes on the markings and place the included anchors into the drilled holes.

 Align and place the mounting plate on top of the anchors and use the included screws to secure the mounting plate to the surface.




Figure 5: Attaching the Cables

 Plug the Ethernet cable into the LAN (PoE) port of the device. (Optional) Plug the telephone cable to the telephone port of the device.

 Attach the DAP-2620 to the mounting plate by snapping the device onto the plate and use the Allen key to lock it in at the top.

Appendix - Statements

ErP Power Usage

This device is an Energy Related Product (ErP) that automatically switches to a power-saving Network Standby mode within 1 minute of no packets being transmitted. It can also be turned off through a power switch to save energy when it is not needed.

Network Standby: 5.92 watts

This device is for indoor use only when using all channels in the 5.15 to 5.25 GHz frequency range. High power radars are allocated as primary users of the 5.25 to 5.35 GHz and 5.65 to 5.85 GHz bands. These radar stations can cause interference with and/or damage this device. This device will not operate on channels which overlap the 5600-5650 MHz band.

It is restricted to indoor environments only.
