

## DSL-200 installation in Win98SE


Go to Control Panel > System > Device Manager> Network Adapter > D-Link DSL-200 ADSL... Right-click on "D-Link DSL-200 ADSL...", Select "Remove"

**DO NOT** Restart your Computer now.

Go to Start > Programs > MS-DOS Prompt

Type in the following commands (ignore the "File not found" mesg if any):

DEL c:\windows\system\dlfwload.sys

DEL c:\windows\inf\other\D-Linkdlwload.inf


DEL c:\windows\system\dlwusb.sys

DEL c:\windows\inf\other\dlwusb.inf

DEL c:\windows\inf\other\D-Linkdllload.inf

UNPLUG the DSL-200 from your PC

RESTART your PC now by going to Start > Shut Down > Restart.

After the PC finishes booting up, Plug DSL-200 back into your PC now.







Click Finish.

For Australia Telstra Bigpond ADSL, select 3) VC Multiplexing..., VCI=35, VPI=8.







Remove the floppy disk from your disk drive.

After PC completes restarting, go to My Computer > Dial-Up Networking, you will see:




Double-click on "DSL-200 ADSL Connection":




Enter your Username and Password according to what are given to you by your ISP. Click Connect.

You can check the connection speed by double-click on the icon at the bottom right corner.


