

Example of Setting up Data Filter in DI-804

Interface to DI-804 via web browser as usual:

Click on “Advanced Features”

Click on “Advanced Filter/Firewall”

Click on “Set 2. Default Data Filter”

Click on Filter Rule “2” button (because “1” is used by default for “xNetBios -> DNS”)

Specify the specific IP addresses, and port range.

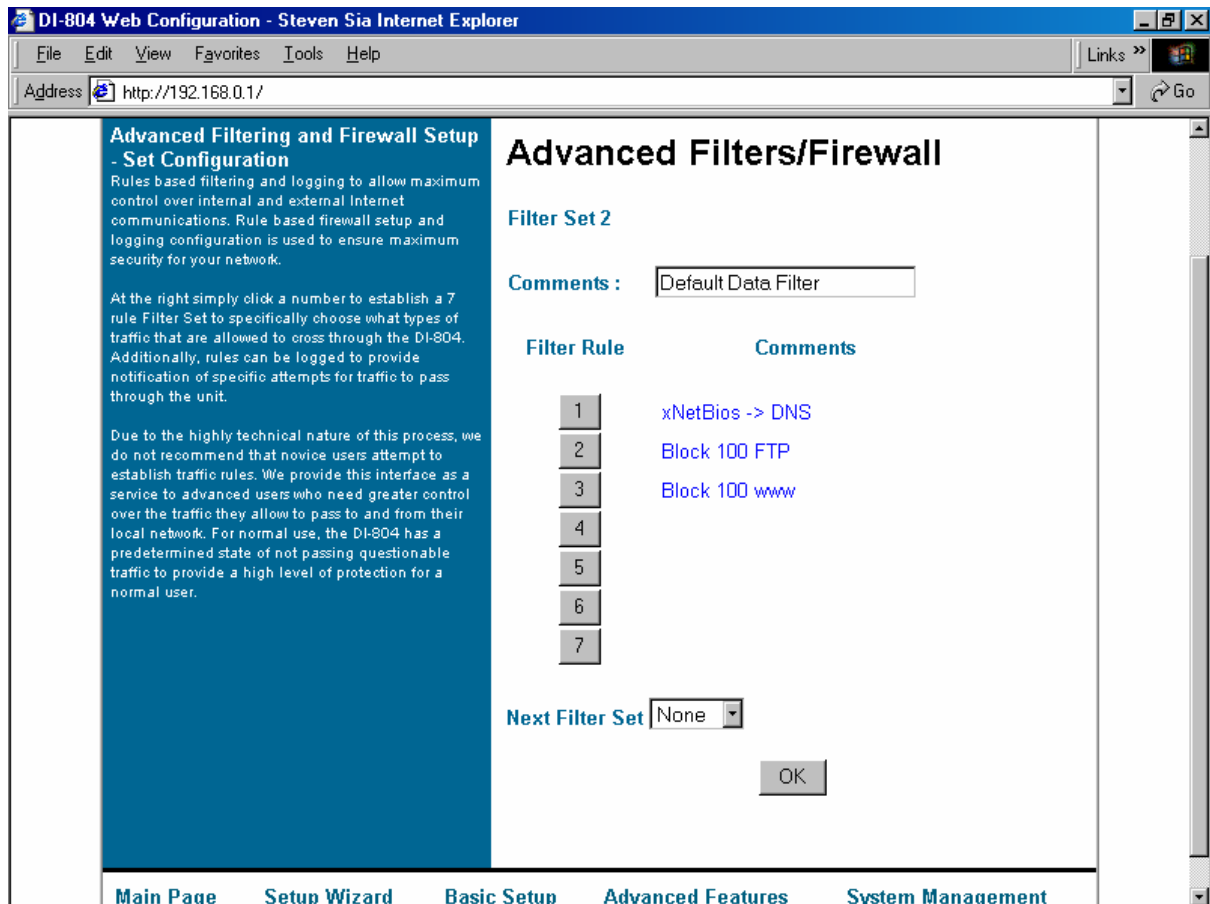
